**Flu vaccine available for students, non-students**

FOR STUDENTS: Crandall Health Center is offering influenza vaccine for students who did not receive the flu vaccine during the past year. While this flu vaccine was not developed specifically for the strain

of virus causing the current H1N1 (Swine flu) outbreak, the Allegany County Department of Health (ACDOH) has advised us that the vaccine may provide some protection, and has encouraged us to promote vaccination. Many students will be traveling to various destinations at semester's end, and receiving the vaccination as soon as possible will provide time for the vaccine to stimulate the development of antibodies before departing Alfred. Vaccinations at Crandall Health Center are available to students only, at a cost of \$25.00 Please call the Health Center at 871-2400 to schedule an appointment.

FOR STUDENTS & NON-STUDENTS: Allegany County Department of Health will be at the Powell Campus Center on Monday, May 4th from 9am - 11am to offer vaccine for non-students as well as students, at a cost of \$30.00; ACDOH is able to bill Medicare.

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### **NYS Withholding Tax Table Changes**

New York State did NOT make changes to the withholding tax table for employees earning less than \$200,000.

NYS did revise the withholding tax computation rules for employees earning over \$200,000 per year. The new tables are effective with the May 15 payroll. Affected employees who need to adjust their withholding tax should complete form IT-2104 (Employee's Withholding Allowance Certificate) in the Payroll Office in Greene Hall.

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### **Chemical Waste Removal**

A chemical waste removal will occur during the week of 05/25/09. Both hazardous (regulated by EPA, DEC, or other government agency) and non-regulated (not regulated by said agencies but not approved for local landfill or drain disposal) waste will be accepted for removal.

In order to obtain TSDF approvals and estimate the cost for removal I will need a waste log sheet(s) of your waste sent to EH&S no later than Friday 5/15/09.

Waste may still be accumulated until 5/20/09. Notify EHS of the additional waste by faxing or e-mailing a new waste log sheet adding the word "Amended" to the title no later than 05/21/09. Waste log sheets can be faxed to the attention of Dean Perry at x2086 or e-mailed to [perrydr@alfred.edu](mailto:perrydr@alfred.edu). Hazardous Waste Log Forms are available at <http://our.alfred.edu/ind...> under the heading "AU EH&S Forms".

All Satellite Accumulation Areas must be emptied and waste received in your respective Central Accumulation Area no later than Wednesday 05/20/09. NYSCC contact EH&S x2190 or Shanti x2497 (Harder and McMahon CAA's); non-statutory AU contact EH&S x2190 (Myers CAA) to arrange for receipt of your waste in Central Accumulation. DO NOT LEAVE WASTE OUTSIDE THE DOOR OF THE CAA!

Note: Inspections must continue if hazardous waste is to remain in a SAA over the summer months; please ensure arrangements have been made within the department to maintain compliance with this law.

All Satellite Accumulation Area labels must be filled-out completely with EPA# for respective college, building name, Room # or area name, start date, full/fill date, initials, chemical name(s) of constituents in the accumulation container with volume or weight, and waste characteristics prior to receipt in Central Accumulation. SAA containers must be capped, have clean exteriors, and SAA label easily legible.
