JoAnn Burkholder is internationally known for her research on harmful algal blooms, particularly that of the toxic dinoflagellate *Pfiesteria*, a one-celled organism that occurs in agriculturally polluted coastal waters. Her research has earned her scholarly and environmental recognition, such as the Scientific Freedom and Responsibility Award of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and being named Conservationist of the Year (1998) by the National Wildlife Federation, the North Carolina Wildlife Federation, and the Governor of North Carolina.

The Burdick Lecture series is a memorial to Harold O. Burdick and supported by the H.O. Burdick Memorial Fund.
