Alfred University stands behind the idea that we all benefit when a greater share of Americans register and vote. An important general election will be held on Nov. 2, 2010. If you are not already registered to vote, please consider doing so now.

Alfred University students often have a choice of registering and voting right here in Allegany County (if you have been a resident in your present address for at least 30 days before the election) or voting by absentee ballot in your home county or state. The choice is yours, but please plan to register and vote on Nov. 2.

You can download the registration form and get more information about voting in New York State, including instructions on how to vote by absentee ballot, at this Web site maintained by the NYS Board of Elections: <http://www.elections.stat...> Applications must be postmarked not later than Friday, Oct. 8 and received by a board of elections not later than Oct. 13 to be eligible to vote in the General Election.
