### **Yoshiko Chuma Art Talk**

Internationally renowned artist YOSHIKO CHUMA will be speaking about her work and her latest performance project in Palestine this Friday at 1 in Miller 301 (3rd floor). Chuma, who is artistic director and choreographer of The School of Hard Knocks, USA and of Daghdha Dance Company, Ireland, was born in Osaka, Japan and has lived in the United States since 1978. Chuma has created more than 45 full-length company works, commissions and site-specific events for venues across the world, constantly challenging the notion of performing for both audience and participant. Her work has been presented in New York in venues ranging from the Joyce Theater to the legendary annual Halloween Parade; and abroad in such locations as the former National Theater of Sarajevo, the perimeter of the Hong Kong harbor and at an ancient ruin in Macedonia. Yoshiko Chuma is the recipient of several fellowships and awards, including those from the Guggenheim Foundation, National Endowment for the Arts, New York Foundation for the Arts, Japan Foundation, Meet the Composer Choreographer/Composer Commission and Philip Morris New Works. She received a New York Dance & Performance Award ("Bessie") in 1984 and has led workshops and master classes throughout Eastern and Western Europe, Asia, The Middle East, Russia and the U.S. Chuma is a guest artist at AU funded by the Marlin and Ginger Miller Dance Residency Program.

### Safety tips for walking on ice

Please use extreme caution when traveling by foot or vehicle in and around the construction areas on campus. Pay special attention to the crosswalk area near the McMahon bldg. as well as the driveways between Perlman Hall and Myers Hall and Powell Campus Center. The construction vehicles are doing their best to look out for pedestrians; however, they also need your help in paying attention to dangerous situations. Do not cross behind any construction vehicle or delivery truck unless you have been told to do so by one of the traffic spotters. If there is no spotter, you must cross in front of the vehicle after you have the driver's attention and their vehicle is stopped.
