### Campus Network Outage March 5

On Saturday, March 5, 2011 at 6 AM, ITS will be performing scheduled maintenance on the Campus Network. The following network services will temporarily be unavailable until the maintenance is completed:

- The "U: drive" server (Personal folders, Personal web sites, Shared folders)
- Campus Network Printing in common areas and computer labs
- Homework and quizzes accessed via WebWork Math Department server

The maintenance also includes one of the servers used to authenticate user accounts and passwords. While we have multiple servers that can authenticate user login requests, some people may experience intermittent issues connecting to network resources such as email, web portals and BlackBoard.

### Reminder - AU Animal Control Policy

As the result of a growing number of complaints and a recent incident whereby an individual was bitten by a dog in a building on campus, we wish to remind you of the University's policy regarding animals on campus.

Alfred University prohibits animals of any kind, with the exception of service animals while performing their duties (owners must properly dispose of their service animals' waste) and aquarium fish (as per residence life policies), in campus buildings.

Animals may be permitted elsewhere on campus as long as they are leashed, attended by the owner at all times, and not interfering with normal use of University facilities.

Stray animals found on campus will be removed.

Violations of the animal control policy should be reported to the Chief of Public Safety. It should further be noted that all service animals must be leashed and under the control of the owner at all times while on University property and must be registered with the Public Safety office.

### EndNote update - X4.0.2 Now Available for Both Windows and Mac

If you have EndNote on a Windows machine, Upgrade from EndNote X4 through Help > EndNote Program Updates.

If you want to start using EndNote, download from the u:drive > Public > AULibraries > EndNote. Access the u:drive from my.alfred.edu or our.alfred.edu.

What's new in EndNote X4.0.2?

- \* Microsoft Word 2011 compatibility.
- \* The Word autogroup no longer changes the current library selection when using Cite While You Write.
- \* PDF imports now search PubMed to complete citation data with additional fields not found in CrossRef.
- \* 'Find Full Text' has a broader reach.
- \* Reference edits within the Online Search mode are retained when copied to a local library.
- \* Word 2008 on Leopard 10.6 no longer crashes after printing.
