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### Reminder - AU Animal Control Policy

As the result of a growing number of complaints and a recent incident whereby an individual was bitten by a dog in a building on campus, we wish to remind you of the University's policy regarding animals on campus.

Alfred University prohibits animals of any kind, with the exception of service animals while performing their duties (owners must properly dispose of their service animals' waste) and aquarium fish (as per residence life policies), in campus buildings.

Animals may be permitted elsewhere on campus as long as they are leashed, attended by the owner at all times, and not interfering with normal use of University facilities.

Stray animals found on campus will be removed.

Violations of the animal control policy should be reported to the Chief of Public Safety. It should further be noted that all service animals must be leashed and under the control of the owner at all times while on University property and must be registered with the Public Safety office.

Visiting Ceramic Artist Presentation: Neil Brownsword  
Monday, March 14 at 5 p.m. in Nevins

Born and raised near Stoke-on-Trent, ceramic artist Neil Brownsword began working at the Wedgwood factory at age 16. He studied ceramics at the University of Wales Institute, Cardiff, at the Royal Academy in London, and received his Ph.D. from Brunel University in London following the completion of his groundbreaking series, Collaging History.

Neil's work draws intensely from his surroundings in Stoke-on-Trent. Growing up there, amidst the decline of the Potteries, he has found a rich source of inspiration and material in the detritus and clay waste that lies beneath the city. By collecting and re-using these various scraps, the fusing and meltings he has found from the factory floor, and assembling them into beautiful abstract amalgams - often further transformed by re-firing - Brownsword regenerates this material into structures and landscapes with various levels of meaning. His work comments on and explores the history and social experience of working in the city's pottery industry.
