### Help to Restock Women's Shelter in Owego

AU graduate student Julie Ilowiecki is raising support for Domestic Violence Awareness Month by organizing a drive for the women's shelter in Owego, which was badly damaged in the recent flooding.

In the aftermath of the recent upstate New York flooding, the women's shelter in Owego is without many basic essentials. Ilowiecki is working with John Dougherty, AU chief of Public Safety, to collect items to support the shelter and help its staff and residents recover from the loss.

Items to be collected in the drive include household items such as dishes, pots and pans; bed and bath linens; personal care products, including baby diapers, shampoo, soap, toothbrushes, deodorant and personal hygiene products; and children's books and toys.

Collection boxes are located at the AU Lea Powell Institute for Children and Families, Sayles Street, Alfred; the AU Wellness Center, Park Street; the Science Center; and the Powell Campus Center at the Domestic Violence Awareness table.
