HR Tip of the Month

Did you know that as an employee of Alfred University you may qualify for Public Service Loan Forgiveness on your federal direct student loans?

Qualifying Factors:

- *Must work at least 30 hours a week
- *Your federal loans have to be Direct Loans to qualify
- *Your loans must be paid under an income based repayment plan
- *Have to make 120 on-time qualifying payments then the rest of your loans are forgiven
- *Complete and submit the Employment Certification for Public Service Loan Forgiveness form yearly to your loan servicer to certify your employment

Human Resources can certify your employment and verify employment dates. You will fill out the first page of the attached document, HR will fill out the second page, and the remaining pages are for your reference.
