I have been breaking Horses ever since I Left until this Spring I have

Secured about \$1500⁰⁰ I intend to invest
in Cattle or Sheep next Spring, I have
a good Situation keeping a set of Books
here, I get $\frac{\$15}{\text{month}}$ a month for a Upson
and all Free Beer Cigars & Whiskey I only
wish You could share a part with me
I know it would do You good

Mason is staying at the McBurney
House here, he intends going Home next week
he is waiting for a Draft,

Please give my kindest
regards to Doctor Kittson and tell him the
medicine he gave me, done me a power of good
in fact - Cured me before I got to Helena.
