

More than 50 companies to attend AU Career Fair

Alfred University's annual Career Fair will draw more than 50 potential employers to campus on Thursday, March 20, from 1-4 p.m. in McLane Center gym on the AU campus. "We are pleased with the turn-out from prospective employers," said Kathy Woughter, director of Alfred University's Career Development Center, which sponsors the annual fair. "We know that the economy is slow, and we anticipated we might have fewer companies signing up. We found, however, that prospective employers are willing to travel to Alfred to recruit our students and graduates. That speaks very highly of the quality of students employers find here." The event, which is sponsored by PPG Industries, is open to all students, alumni and community members, said Woughter. She advises those planning to attend the Career Fair to dress professionally and to bring several copies of their resume to give to prospective employers. No advance registration is necessary. Members of Lambda Chi Alpha and the student chapter of the American Marketing Association are assisting at the fair.
