

Interdisciplinary artist Audra Wolowiec to give talk at Alfred University

ALFRED, NY Audra Wolowiec, an interdisciplinary artist whose work has been shown internationally and in the United States, will give a talk on Tuesday, March 20, at 5:30 p.m. in Alfred University's Binns-Merrill 106C. The talk, which is sponsored by the AU School of Art and Design, Sculpture/Dimensional Studies and Foundations, is free.

Wolowiec's work oscillates between sculpture, installation, text and performance with an emphasis on sound and the material qualities of language. Her poetic sound installations and experimental language scores often use the gap, space, or breath between speech — not as forms of negation, but as generators of meaning.

Her work has been shown at MASS MoCA, Art in General, Studio 10, The Poetry Project, Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art, Stony Brook University, and the Center for Performance Research. Residencies include Bemis Center for Contemporary Art; Complex Systems Art and Physics Residency at the University of Oregon, supported by a National Science Foundation grant; and Dieu Donn e. She is based between New York City and the Hudson Valley, and currently teaches at Parsons School of Design, SUNY Purchase.
