

## **AU professor to speak on human-caused climate change**

Assistant Professor of Environmental Studies Eugene Wahl will be lecturing on Nov. 12 at 12:20 p.m. as part of the Environmental Studies Speakers Series. His title is "Global Temperatures Over the Last Two Millennia, Recent Controversy and Modern Human-Caused Climate Change." In addition to his faculty position at AU, Wahl is adjunct professor of environmental ethics at St. Mary-of-the-Woods College, Ind. Wahl has taught at the high school, undergraduate and graduate levels in the areas of environmental studies, earth history, environmental ethics, philosophy, economics and mathematics. Much of Wahl's research focuses on climate change and its implications. Wahl earned his Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota. He completed a post-doctoral fellowship in the Advanced Studies Program at the National Center for Atmospheric Research, where he was also a visiting scientist.
