

George to serve on AU Board of Trustees

Frederick A. George, a 1975 graduate of Alfred University and a member of AU's Alumni Council for the past four years, will join the Alfred University Board of Trustees at its October meeting. "Fred George's background and experience in management, as well as his work with the Alumni Council over the past four years, will make him a valuable member of the AU Board of Trustees," said AU President Charles M. Edmondson. "The trustees and I are delighted he agreed to serve." George was nominated by the Alumni Council to serve a three-year term as an alumni-elected trustee. After receiving a B.A. degree in political science, George remained at Alfred to earn a master's degree in education. As a student, he was a member of the A.U. track team, was active in the African-American student group and was manager of the pub, the Saxon Underground, located in the former Rogers Campus Center. Following graduation from AU, George joined the staff of the Admissions office. He left in 1979 to join the Norton Company and then moved to Data General, first as a recruiter and then as an employee benefits counselor. From there he went to Millipore and then to Syncra Software, Inc., where he was chief operations officer. Currently, George is principal of GeoSimms Consulting, a management consulting practice. George and his wife Virginia live in Northborough, MA, where he has served as a selectman. He was elected town moderator in May 2003. They have a grown son.
