

Professor's work added to 'In Sight/On Site' in Fredonia

Alfred University Associate Professor of Sculpture, Brett Hunter's sculpture "Anchors and Gears" is the latest addition to the "In Sight/On Site" sculpture program at the State University of New York (SUNY) at Fredonia. His piece is more than six feet tall and was made from pieces of granite and steel over the course of several months. It will remain on the campus for two years. Hunter said "The work focuses on the ideas, issues or experiences that set individuals apart from one another." He was invited to participate in this Fredonia program after Robert Booth, professor of Visual Arts and New Media and head of the sculpture curriculum, SUNY Fredonia, saw Hunter's work on display at the Jamestown Community College, Jamestown Campus. Hunter earned his B.A. from Kalamazoo College in Kalamazoo, MI. He received his M.F.A. from Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, OH. Some of his past exhibits have included a two-person exhibition at the Howard County Center for the Arts in 2004; Burlington County College Sculpture Garden Exhibition, in Pemberton, NJ in 2003; and in Western Carolina University's Outdoor Sculpture Exhibition in Cullowhee, NC in 2003.
