DEPARTMENTS.

The Institution is designed for both Gentlemen and Ladies, furnishing them equal facilities and granting them equal privileges. It has organized the following Departments: Primary, Preparatory, Grammar, Academic, Collegiate, and Theological. It has established the following Courses of Study: Classical, Scientific, Combined or Ladies', Theological, Industrial Mechanics, the Special Courses of Art and Music, and an Elective.

COURSES OF STUDY.

PRIMARY DEPARTMENT.

FIRST YEAR.

FIRST TERM.—Reading from Charts and First Reader, first half; Printing of Words, Counting, Reading, and writing of numbers to 100; Color, primary; Adding and Subtracting of numbers under 5.

SECOND TERM.—Reading Second Reader; Spelling in Reading Book; Use of punctuation points; Capital letters; Inflection, &c.; Writing numbers to 1,000; Adding to 10; Lessons in square figures and parallelograms; Color, tints and shade; Inventive Drawing.

THIRD TERM.—Second Reader, one half book; Spelling in Reader; Punctuation; Capital Letters; Inflection and Tone; Inventive Drawing; Counting; Adding and Subtracting; Oral Lessons; Color Patterning.

SECOND YEAR.

FIRST TERM.—Second Reader completed; Spelling in Reader; Arithmetic; Oral Exercises; Inventive Drawing; Color, mixture.

SECOND TERM.—Reading Third Reader, one fourth book; Spelling in Reader; Oral Arithmetic; Writing sentences on slates; Color, mixing continued.

THIRD TERM.—Reading half of Third Reader; Spelling in Reader; Oral Arithmetic; Oral Geography.

THIRD YEAR.

FIRST TERM.—Reading Third Reader; Speller, Edwards'; Arithmetic, Davie's Primary; Adding and Subtracting; Primary Geography; Natural History, Object Lessons; Color, secondary.

SECOND TERM.—Third Reader completed; Spelling; D. Arithmetic; Multiplication and Division; Primary Geography; Geology; Color.

THIRD TERM.—Reading; General Review.

PREPARATORY DEPARTMENT.

FIRST YEAR.

FIRST TERM.—Apparatus same as for previous year. Davie's Elements of Arithmetic; Geography, No. 2; Reader, No. 3; Elementary Speller; Exercises, Reading, Spelling, Printing; Drawing; Writing commenced with pencil; Singing; Map Drawing. Reviews, daily and weekly. Examination, semi-monthly.

SECOND TERM.—Arithmetic, Davie's Principles; Reading; Elementary Spelling continued; Exercises, with criticisms. Reviews, daily and weekly. Examination, semi-monthly.

THIRD TERM.—Arithmetic, Davie's Primary completed; Geography, No. 2, National Series, completed; Reader, No. 3, National Series, one half completed; Speller; Elementary National Series, continued. Reviews, daily and weekly. Examination, semi-monthly, written.

SECOND YEAR.

FIRST TERM.—Davie's Practical Arithmetic commenced; Geography, No. 3, National Series; Civil Government, oral; Grammar, oral, or elementary; Reader, No. 3, National Series. Exercises same as third term of first year, with Penmanship. Reviews, daily, weekly, and semi-monthly. Examinations, written.

SECOND TERM.—Davie's Practical continued; Geography continued; Civil Government, oral; Grammar, oral or elementary, continued; Reader, No. 3, continued; Speller, Elementary, National Series, continued; Exercises, Reviews, and Examinations.

THIRD TERM.—Davie's Practical; Geography, No. 3, National Series, completed; Civil Government continued; Grammar, Elementary, completed; Reader, No. 3, National Series, completed; Speller, Elementary, completed; Exercises, Reviews, and Examinations.

GRAMMAR DEPARTMENT.

FIRST TERM.—Arithmetic B.; A. Geography; Intellectual Arithmetic; Grammar, Bullion's First Lessons; Edward's Reader; Spelling; Penmanship; Composition.

THEOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.

ADMISSION.

This Department is open for the admission of students from every denomination of Christians. Every student applying for admission must be prepared to produce a certificate of his good standing in some evangelical church. The academic year consists of three terms, corresponding with the terms of College instruction. The public examinations at the close of each term.

COURSE OF STUDY.

The regular course of theological study in this Department occupies three full years. The general order of study in the different departments of Theology is as follows :

JUNIOR CLASS.

Biblical.—Hebrew Grammar and Exercises ; Portions of the Pentateuch and Psalms in Hebrew ; Lectures on Introduction to the New Testament ; Exegesis of the Four Gospels in the Greek Harmony.

Theological.—Theology, as based on the nature and laws of Mind ; the Evidences of Christianity, Inspiration and Canon of the Scriptures ; the Introduction to Theology, God's nature, attributes and works.

Historical.—Lectures on the History of the World before Christ ; Life of Christ.

Homiletical.—Lectures on Pastoral Theology.

MIDDLE CLASS.

Biblical.—Hebrew Exegesis, Isaiah ; Greek Exegesis, Epistles of the New Testament.

Theological.—Anthropology, including the Doctrine of Sin.

Homiletical.—Lectures on the Constitution and Mission of the Church.

Historical.—History of the Apostolic Church, and Ecclesiastical History to the Council of Nice, 325 A. D.

SENIOR CLASS.

Biblical.—Hebrew Exegesis, continued ; Greek Exegesis ; Epistles of the New Testament.

Theological.—Christology, including the Doctrine of Redemption.

Eschatology.—Lectures on the Sabbath, Baptism, and Lord's Supper.

Historical.—The General History of the Church from the fourth century to the present time.

Homiletical.—Lectures on the Composition and Delivery of Sermons, with Exercises.

No charge for tuition or room-rent, for those rooming in the College buildings, is made for students who are studying in this Department with a design to enter the ministry. There is already a well-selected Theological Library, to which valuable additions will be made as fast as possible. There are constant opportunities for students to engage in labor, with small congregations and Sabbath Schools, and thus not only do good service for others, but become the recipients of aid. There are also measures instituted for the purpose of aiding such as may need pecuniary assistance. No possible means or labor will be spared, on the part of the Faculty, to meet all the appointments in this Department.

ELECTIVE COURSE.

Any student, after matriculation, instead of entering either of the General Courses, may select his or her own. The degree given such as have completed an equivalent to a full course is that which best corresponds to the character of the subjects studied.

DEGREES.

Those students who have sustained a good moral character, and satisfactorily completed either of the prescribed Courses, will be admitted to a Degree.

BACHELOR OF ARTS.—The degree of *Bachelor of Arts* is conferred upon those who have successfully completed the Classical Course.

LAUREATE OF ARTS.—The degree of *Laureate of Arts* is conferred upon those who have completed the Ladies' Course.

BACHELOR OF PHILOSOPHY.—The degree of *Bachelor of Philosophy* is conferred upon those who have completed the Philosophical Course, taking Language instead of the Higher Mathematics.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE.—The degree of *Bachelor of Science* is conferred upon those who have completed the Scientific Course, taking the Higher Mathematics instead of Language. It is also conferred upon those who have completed the full course of Industrial Mechanics.

ADVANCED DEGREES.—The advanced degrees of *A. M.*, *Ph. D.*, and *S. M.*, are conferred, in course, upon such as are entitled to them.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION.

LOCATION.

The Institution is located at Alfred, Allegany Co., N. Y., two miles from the Alfred Depot, on the line of the Erie Railway.

The location is retired and healthy—in a rural district, surrounded by delightful scenery, amid a people of integrity, and of industrious and unobtrusive habits. Students are not exposed here to many of the ordinary allurements to vice and dissipation. Few spots are so well adapted to the quiet and successful pursuit of Science and Literature as the village of Alfred.

GOVERNMENT.

Parents who place their children in this Institution, and all Students who are sufficiently old to understand the necessity of order, cannot be too well assured that the following regulations form the most essential part of the contract between them and us; and that whatever student wantonly violates them, and shows himself incorrigibly determined on pursuing his waywardness, will be expelled from the privileges of the Institution.

REGULAR ACADEMIC EXERCISES.

The regular exercises, at which all the Students will be required to attend, unless especially excused, are Chapel exercises each day during the term; Recitations, from two to four, five days each week, from Monday morning till Friday evening; Regular exercises in Compositions, Declamations, Spelling, Reading, and Writing; Literary, Scientific, and Moral Lectures, by the Faculty; Public worship, each week, either on Saturday or Sunday, and Bible-class, according as the Students may be in the habit of attending public worship, either on the seventh or the first day of the week.

ROOMS AND BOARD.

The University Hall contains the Boarding Department, and rooms for the accommodation of about one hundred students, besides rooms for professors and their families, and also Society, Music, and Paint Rooms. *Rooms for Ladies are furnished and carpeted, with a sleeping room adjoining each.* The Hall is under the immediate supervision of the Faculty. There is also abundant accommodation for rooming and boarding in private families.

OBSERVATORY.

The object of the Observatory is two-fold, viz: to facilitate instruction in Astronomy, and to perform such astronomical work as time, limited by class-room duties, will allow.

The Observatory building consists of a circular room, surmounted by a revolving dome 19 feet in diameter, a computing room 12x13, a prime vertical room 12x13, a transit room 12x20, and a clock room 8x20.

The Observatory is furnished with the following instruments:

I. An equatorial refracting telescope, by Henry Fitz, with an object glass of 9 inch clear aperture, and 9.5 feet focus.

II. A meridian circle, by Wm. J. Young, with an object glass by Merz & Mahler, Germany, of 3.25 inch clear aperture, and 4.5 feet focus. The circle is 20 inches in diameter, and reads by 4 verniers to 3 seconds of space.

III. A sidereal chronometer.

IV. A filar micrometer. Value, \$125.

Students in Astronomy have the privileges of the Observatory without extra charge.

LIBRARY.

The Institution Library consists of a choice selection of Histories, Biographies, Greek and Latin Classics, Mathematical and Scientific works, and standard English Literature. Additions are made to it yearly.

GYMNASIUM.

A Gymnasium for young Ladies has recently been established in connection with the Boarding Hall, where all young Ladies boarding in the Institution will be expected to take daily exercise.

They have appreciated the necessity of laying the foundation of intellectual and moral attainments and discipline upon a broad and permanent basis; and they have endeavored to provide the appliances and facilities for securing these objects. They labor to send forth young men and women so educated as to qualify them for the realities and responsibilities of active life.
