Coal Kicks Off Cash Quick Campaign

King Coal, chief executive officer of Alfred E. Newman University, announced yesterday the establishment of a 50-billion dollar fund drive as part of the Cash Quick Campaign.

The intended target group of the fund drive will be prospective students of the university. Starting in the fall, Alfred E. Newman student workers will be hired to phone all prospective students and ask for a small donation, preferably 50 percent of the high schoolers' allowances.

Coal appointed Merry Coinpurse as director of the telefund campaign.

"We see this as a chance for young people to invest in their future. By supporting the university before they attend it, they will ensure that the quality and reputation of the university will be high when they attend it," Coal said.

The university already seeks donations from alumni, parents and friends in its telefund. Now anyone who has requested a college catalogue will be phoned. By including prospective students in the campaign, the university hopes to double its profits.

"High school students are an untapped source of funds," Coinpurse said. "We are all very excited by this new opportunity to ex-

pand our telefund program." Coinpurse calculates that most high school students receive ten dollars a week in an allowance from their parents. This makes over 500 dollars per year. Odd jobs, such as babysitting and mowing lawns, combined with gifts of money received on birthdays and holidays bring the total yearly gross earnings of an average high school student to more than 800 dollars. "We think our telefund workers can talk at least a 400-dollar pledge out of each prospective student. Multiply that by 500

students, and we will be sitting pretty," Coinpurse said. To entice the high schoolers to donate, a special bargain will be made. Anyone pledging more than 50 percent of his allowance and babysitting earnings will be guaranteed a minimum grade point average of 2.5 once enrolling at the university.

"How can these kids lose?" Coal said. "They will increase the quality of their future alma mater while earning themselves a good G.P.A."

At a meeting of the Student Senate last week, the executive board broke into song and performed for the senators an impromptu rendition of the Rocky Horror Picture Show.

"We thought we'd start the meeting off a little differently for a change," said President Dandy Morebucks, who played Frank. "The atmosphere around here has been a real bummer lately."

After receiving a standing ovation, the senate reviewed old business. Morebucks reminded the senators that the bill for the services of legal counselor U. O. Mee had not been paid. He said the senate had several options in resolving the matter. These included:

- 1) paying Mee in full, which would leave the Senate nearly bankrupt.

Marketing Boosts Enrollment

Director of Marketing and Educational Sales, Rhonda Day-olds announced today plans for a new marketing technique to boost enrollment at Alfred E. Newman University.

Starting in the fall semester, the University will have a two-for-one sale. Two students may enroll for the price of tuition for one. This new offer is expected to increase enrollment by attracting young newlyweds and fraternal and identical twins.

Over the past decade, the rate of teen marriages has increased dramatically. Often these students do not go to college because of financial restrictions, Day-olds said.

"With our new marketing campaign, a young husband and wife can both earn degrees with only half of the normal financial burden," Day-olds said.

Other statistics show that due to the in-

creased use of fertility drugs over the past years, the number of twins born in this country has increased dramatically. Day-olds said that Alfred E. Newman's current enrollment of twins is quite low, and that the new campaign should combat this problem.

As an added benefit, the two-for-one sale will increase the diversity of the student body. "Not only will there be engineers, artists, business people and nurses at Alfred E. Newman, but we will soon have many young families and twins."

As a result of the enrollment of these new types of students, several special programs will be established, said Dean Queen, vice-president of Student Affairs.

OZ Helpline will now be prepared to counsel twins with identity crises as well as young couples with domestic arguments. They will also establish a special hotline to give advice on coordinating fashion designs for twins and on pre-natal care for expectant mothers.

Twins will have the option of enrolling with the same major. This will give them the advantage of alternating attendance in classes.

"One twin might want to attend classes during the first and third weeks of each month, and the other on the second and fourth weeks. This will leave more time for socializing during a twin's week off."

Babysitting services will be available at the Campus Center. "Students will be able to drop their kids off at the information desk and then take off to class. We are increasing our support staff on Friday afternoons to allow for the increased need of babysitters during happy hours."

University Solves Parking Problem

Alfred E. Newman University's parking problem has been solved. A majority decision was reached to eliminate all parking on campus.

Bessie Newman, as she is affectionately called, bellowed a positive, "Moooooo!!," when asked for a comment.



Morose Field Troubles Continue Athletic Department to Build Suctiondome

The on-going debate at Alfred E. Newman University over the troubles with Morose Field appears to have come to a conclusion. The AEN Suction Athletic Department appears to have arrived at a feasible solution to the problems which now exist at Morose Field. The men, celebrating one of their best seasons, were having a picnic at Tech Lake. As they were inclined to do, they went swimming after their meal.




Medical authorities stated that their food-laden bodies could not tolerate the strenuous activity of championship swimming.



