Received your letter yesterday and was glad to learn that you have made glazes for a lower temperature. I think that will be much better than trying to force the kiln to mature the old glazes. I suppose you will test the new glaze before you send it to be sure it is satisfactory. I hope however that you can send it quite soon because they are anxious to get things going here. You only mentioned blue and

given in your letter. I suppose  
you will make other colors later.  
I would like it very much  
if you could send about 1000  
grams of the base dry so  
that I could be working out  
some colors too. Also the  
bright glaze and the cones  
which I mentioned in my last  
letter would be very useful if  
you can spare them.
