On Wednesday, March 21, at 8 p.m. in Holmes Auditorium, Dr. Kimberly Bostwick, Research Associate and Curator, Cornell University Museum of Vertebrates, will present an illustrated talk for the general public on "Playing a Wing Instrument: Solo Performance by a Rainforest Bird." This is a fascinating story of the anatomical and behavioral adaptations of a unique avian courtship ritual.

Dr. Bostwick has done considerable field research on birds in South America, Africa and Papua New Guinea.

Incident Notification Bulletin

At approximately 11:25 p.m. on March 16, 2007 the Office of Public Safety was notified that a female student was approached by a male in an aggressive manner. The female student was walking alone behind Reimer Hall when the male appeared from between two parked cars and grabbed her around the torso. When this occurred, the female student fought back striking the assailant several times breaking free from his hold and running to a safe location. The only description of the male assailant is that he is between 5'8" and 5'10" tall and wearing a dark winter coat. This incident is now being investigated by the Alfred University Office of Public Safety and the Alfred Police Department.
