Spector is professor and chair of the Department of Art at Cornell University.

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## Travel Policy Update

A new institutional travel policy was published and there are a few items we would like to highlight:

Alcohol is no longer eligible for reimbursement unless for authorized entertainment of a donor.

A per diem for meals is available at the federal rate (or lower) but only with a signed Travel Authorization and Advance Form. With this in place receipts would no longer be required for meals; otherwise all receipts are required.

Faculty and staff should continue to use the Motor Pool. If a vehicle is not available a denial e-mail is required to receive the \$0.40 per mile rate instead of \$0.20. (Students are exempt from this Motor Pool requirement).
