This year our topic is the Social Change model of leadership and we have invited Kathy Shellogg, the Associate Vice President for Student Life at Nebraska Wesleyan University and an expert in this model, to join us for the day.

The Social Change model is being recommended for adoption by the Student Affairs Division as we look to coordinate our leadership training efforts. This model emphasizes that every student is a potential leader; that leadership is a process, not a position; that leadership can be learned; and that service is a powerful vehicle for promoting leadership development.

As faculty and staff, we educate our students as leaders in multiple contexts across the University. Rarely, however, do we have the chance to come together and talk about leadership development as a concept, and discuss strategies and techniques that can help our students become better leaders.
