You may send your outgoing U.S. mail to Office Services to have it digitally imprinted with the correct postage on each piece through the Pitney Bowes mailing machine. Taking the time to properly prepare your mail can save you time and money.

Save on postage - use #10 envelopes instead of 9x12 flat envelopes

Separate your international mail from mailing

Separate seal and non-sealed envelopes

Have a mail process form filled out completely

Mail is picked up once a day by 4 p.m. Please have mail here by 3 p.m. to insure it will be sent out that day.

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Talk By Manuel Delanda

"Symbolic and Material Culture:
The Place of Craft in the Philosophy of Matter"

Manuel DeLanda is one of the most original thinkers writing today. His work focuses on diverse fields such as economics, nonlinear dynamics, chaos theory, geology, architecture, self-organizing autonomous systems, artificial intelligence, artificial life, and the history of science.

After studying art in the 1970s, DeLanda became known as an independent filmmaker. His underground 8mm and 16mm films, circulating internationally, were inspired by critical theory and philosophy.

In the 1980s, he focused on programming, writing computer software, and producing computer-based art. After being introduced to the work of Gilles Deleuze, Manuel DeLanda saw new creative potential in philosophical texts, becoming one of the representatives of the 'new materialism'.

Manuel DeLanda's published books include War in the Age of Intelligent Machines (1991), A Thousand Years of Nonlinear History (1997), Intensive Science and Virtual Philosophy (2002), New Philosophy of Society: Assemblage Theory and Social Complexity (2006), Deleuze: History and Science (2010). His most recent book is Philosophy & Simulation: The Emergence of Synthetic Reason (2011).

China Media Inside and Out - Feb. 21

A lecture by Philip J. Cunningham, currently a Visiting Scholar in Asian Studies at Cornell University.

He lived in China during most of the 1980s, participated in the events in Beijing during May and June, 1989 as an activist and BBC reporter, and wrote about his firsthand experiences in "Tiananmen Moon," published in 2009.

A Nieman Fellow in Journalism at Harvard and a Fulbright Fellow, Cunningham speaks Thai, Japanese, and Mandarin. For 25 years, he has written frequently for China Daily and the South China Morning Post and appeared as a commentator on CCTV, particularly on the CCTV-9 program "Dialogue" hosted by Yang Rui.
