A Children's Literature exhibit is on display at the Hinkle Memorial Library Gallery at Alfred State College through Sunday, May 5.

Hinkle Librarian Barbara Greil and Instructional Support Assistant Jenny Hillenbrand organized this exhibit in celebration of National Library Week, April 14-20. Contacting local and regional artists, authors and illustrators, as well as faculty and staff from both Alfred State College and Alfred University, they have brought together a wide variety of work, highlighting the importance of libraries, reading, literature, and learning.

The exhibit includes custom-made American Library Association READ Posters featuring Alfred State College "celebrities" posing with their favorite books, designed and created by Hillenbrand.

Also featured are an extensive collection of ingenious children's pop-up books, on loan from Alfred University professor and artist Anne Currier.
