Postage Increase Effective Jan. 26, 2014

The USPS has announced that effective Sunday, Jan. 26, 2014 there will be an increase in the single-piece First-Class mail pricing. Attached is a chart that shows what the increases will be.

Additionally, letters to all International destinations will increase to \$1.15 (1 oz.).

There is a \$.01 per mail piece savings if letters are processed through the postage meter located in Office Services.

Helene fought hard through many surgeries and procedures; however, her spinal cord was severely damaged. She was transferred to Atlanta, GA for intensive physical therapy, hopeful that she would be able to recover.
