These intuitively driven works are created in collaboration with dynamic artists in the visual arts, performance, music, theater and dance; and have been performed internationally (Japan, Czech Republic, Germany, Mexico, The United Kingdom) and nationally (New York, California, Washington, Vermont, South Carolina, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Florida, Texas, Pennsylvania, Alabama) in theaters, galleries, and visually inspiring sites.

Recently her Framing New York exhibit on Governors Island in New York City was attended by more than 1,500 viewers.

Angier lives and works in both Brooklyn and in Alfred and is a Professor at Alfred University. She presents her research, creates new work and teaches site specific choreography workshops at international festivals and Universities.
