Lawrence Brose of Buffalo will be participating in an artist residency at the Institute for Electronic Arts the week of March 16. Currently serving as a visiting assistant professor at the University of Buffalo teaching courses in the art of photography, Brose's extensive artistic practice spans from the mid 1980s to the present day, receiving innumerable grants, residencies, awards, and has shown his work nationally and internationally.

Throughout his residency, Brose will be continuing a series of work taking high-resolution scans of frames from his film work, processing these images, and producing prints of various types. He will also be exploring use of alternative photography techniques to make cyanotype prints.

This multi-media program presents Pete Seeger's spoken words - in his own recorded voice - set to live music and video based on the Grammy nominated audio project conceived and produced by world-renowned percussionist and producer Jeff Haynes.

Jeff will present new music created by musicians from traditions as diverse as African music, blues, bluegrass, classical guitar, folk, jazz and Native American music to accompany and interact with Pete Seeger's voice - painting an evocative aural backdrop for Pete's most engaging stories, narratives, and poems reflecting his lifelong dedication to human rights, environmental issues, and boundless hope for humanity.

Haynes and Seeger, working closely for over five years, have created something spectacular. See www.jeffhaynesmusic.com.
