Most of these vehicles reserved for the entire summer travel very few miles and the payback does not cover the maintenance on the vehicles during this period. Math Talk 'Symmetric Products of Graphs' - Evan Witz

The AU Math Division Presents a Math Talk presented by Evan Witz.

The talk will be on Tuesday. April 28 at 12:20 p.m. in Myers Hall Rm. 334.

Title: "This is a graph theory based talk in which we discuss the concept of a hyperspace graph. Graphs are useful in many different sorts of modeling, from turing machines in Computer Science to evolutionary trees in Biology. Graphs are useful in these regards because they give a very intuitive way of showing how elements of finite sets (such as machine states in turing machines, or species/families/etc. in evolutionary trees) interact with one another. This is done by establishing adjacencies between members of the sets that are in some way related. However, we may also want to construct a way to relate multiple members of our sets to others; that is, rather than observing one turing machine state or species at a time, we may want to see how a collection of states or species interact with other such collections. Our hyperspace graphs provide a method for this. In this talk, we will describe these hyperspace graphs, and establish several theorems dealing with their planarity, order, size and classification."

FMA Talk: Mitchell Holbrook - Market Valuation Through Data Analysis

Mitch Holbrook will be presenting a FMA Talk in the Olin Building Rm. 310 on Thursday, April 30 at 9:30 a.m.

The talk will be about how the classic axiom of investing is to buy low and sell high. This is a difficult task as most investors do not have a simple method to determine when a market is under or over valued at a given time. Through the use of mathematical analysis we are able to create a new index that represents the intrinsic value of the S&P 500. We then show that the intrinsic value index is relatively accurate in determining market bottoms, which investors could use as a signal to enter the market with a larger margin of safety.
