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IEA Visiting Artist: Traci Molloy

Traci Molloy of Brooklyn will be participating in the artist-in-residence program of the Institute for Electronic Arts over the week of May 18. Receiving her MFA from the University of Ohio, Molloy sees herself as an artist and social activist, exploring adolescent culture, loss, and violence through photography, digital arts, installation, painting, and printmaking.

Throughout her residency, Molloy will be working on a series of digital prints in partnership with adolescents from the surrounding community, superimposing their responses to the prompts "I Am, I Will, I'm Afraid" in their handwriting over photographs of themselves, obscuring their image and, with the body of work as a whole, representing the collective feelings of the adolescents of the Southern Tier region. These images will be printed larger than life-scale as well as life-scale for exhibitions.
