The Legal Services Initiative (<http://www.aging.ny.gov/l...>) is a collaborative public/private effort to increase access to affordable legal assistance by the State's:

- * Older adults,
- * Persons of all ages with disabilities, and
- * The caregivers of these population groups.

The ultimate aim of this Initiative is to advance equal access to justice for these individuals. We are seeking your assistance in implementing a survey of New York residents of all ages with all types of disabilities, including: Physical, mental health, cognitive, developmental or intellectual, chronic medical or health conditions, or other impairments, frailties, or conditions - that limit an individual's ability to perform activities of daily living without assistance from other people, devices, or equipment.

The survey of New Yorkers with disabilities is one of seven surveys conducted under the auspices of the New York State Legal Services Initiative. Six of the Initiative's surveys are completed. For many years the Finger Lakes region has inspired many local artists with its bountiful natural beauty and world-class wines. Since the first annual Plein Air Arts Festival in 2012, the eastern shore of Seneca Lake has provided a warm atmosphere and stunning backdrop for many artists' works. Now in its 4th year, the festival will once again invite local artists to create artwork en plein air (in open air) throughout the day, followed by an art reception and auction later in the evening, accompanied by live music with local food and wine.

The Plein Air Art Festival is a public event scheduled for Saturday, July 25, 2015, along the eastern side of Seneca Lake. Between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m., artists will be scheduled to create works of art at various partner wineries. A silent auction and reception for the day's plein air artwork will take place from 5 until 7 p.m. at Damiani Wine Cellars.
