New Printing Systems and the Campus Computer Labs

Over the summer, the Libraries, ITS, and Office & Procurement Services have been working together to implement a new printing system in the libraries and in campus computer labs.

The new printing system will make it easier for students to print by sending their print jobs to a single print queue and then releasing the print job at any of nine public printers on campus.

Three of the nine printers are in Scholes Library, three are in Herrick Library, one is in Olin 215, one is in the basement of Seidlin Hall 016, and Seidlin Annex (Engineering Lab.)

Faculty and staff who print in the libraries will want to be aware of the new printing procedure. After sending an item to print, you will release it either by logging into the printer with your AU username and password, or by swiping a "key fob" at the printer.

For convenience, if you print regularly in the libraries, you will want to obtain a key fob from the mailroom in the Powell Campus Center. There is no charge for the key fob, but a \$5 fee will be charged for a replacement if the original key fob is lost.

Office and departmental printers are NOT affected by this change; it applies only to public printers in the libraries and in campus computer labs.
