The Alfred University 2014-15 Annual Campus Safety & Fire Report is now available. This report is required by federal law to be published each October for the previous calendar year and contains policy statements and crime statistics for our school.

The policy statements address Alfred's policies, procedures, and programs concerning safety and security, for example, policies for responding to emergency situations and sexual offenses.

Three years' worth of statistics are included for certain types of crimes that were reported to have occurred on campus, in or on off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by the school and on public property within or immediately adjacent to the campus.

You may also request a paper copy from the Office of Public Safety or Dean of Student's Office.
