Alex M. Lee is an artist born in Seoul, Korea, and is currently an assistant professor in the Digital Arts & Sciences Department at Clarkson University in Potsdam. Institute of Chicago with an emphasis in Art & Technology in 2009.

### **Lecture: Mid-19th Century New York Orphan Asylum Trains**

Many immigrants, hoping to find better living conditions in the United States in the mid 19th century, amassed in New York City only to find squalor, gang violence. and disease.

Within a few years, the area was home to 30,000 orphaned and homeless children. As a result of this crisis, a movement (the Orphan Train Movement) to rescue these children was begun to transport them to better living conditions.

Keene is the author of "Abandoned: The Untold Story of Orphan Asylums." Recently published by Willow Manor Publishing, Keene's book presents true-to-life tales of the Five Points area of New York City and the desperation of a million Irish immigrants who hoped to find better conditions in New York after leaving behind the famine they experienced in their homeland in 1848.

The lecture is co-sponsored by the Andover Historical Society and the Thelma Rogers Genealogical and Historical Society. It is free and open to the general public.
