### 'Televisions and Transmissions'

Visiting media curator and scholar Laura McGough will trace a genealogical history of the live video transmission (from broadcasting to streaming) in an effort to describe its reemergence in the post-Internet era. Television, and its most basic technical property, the transmission, continues to haunt media art in the post-Internet age, a specter lurking behind, artist YouTube channels, glitch art and the rediscovery of analog video tools, but perhaps most apparent in the proliferation of live online streaming experiments.

Whether appropriating social broadcasting platforms like Twitch.tv or Periscope or developing their own streaming networks, a growing number of artists are exploring the live transmission as a site for performance, intervention, dissent and audience interaction. In an era marked by video-on-demand, how do we account for this current preoccupation the live transmission?

Laura McGough is a media arts historian, curator and practitioner. She has organized exhibitions, screenings, performances and streaming content for arts organizations in the U.S., Canada, Europe, and Australia.

In 1997, she co-founded the new media collective NOMADS and through this initiative organized a number of early Web-based art initiatives including Audiophile, a six-part sound art series, and published MASSAGE, an early multi-media Web-based journal. Her writings on the visual arts, technology, and performance have appeared in publications such as Sculpture, New Arts Examiner, Experimenta and Digital Creativity, and she has served on the editorial boards of Performance Research and FUSE.

She has also received grants from the D.C. Commission on the Arts and Humanities, the New York State Council on the Arts, the Canada Council and the British Council to support curatorial research projects.

McGough received an M.A. in interdisciplinary studies from New York University and is currently completing a PhD in the Department of Media Study at the University of Buffalo. She is the 2015/2016 Critical Studies Fellow at the Cranbrook Academy of Art. Her current research focuses on artist-produced public access television and the political aesthetics of feedback.

If these topics sound interesting, these undergraduate and graduate summer course offerings are for you! Courses are open to most students but may be subject to instructor permission.

MGMT 300 01/MBA 600 03: People Analytics - This course focuses on the tools, procedures, and analyses used to inform data-based human capital decisions in organizations.

The methods taught in this course will be applied to HR and OB policy in organizations including but not limited to staffing, training, and measuring employee performance and satisfaction. Identification of the appropriate tools and statistical procedures for analyzing human capital will be emphasized along with the ability to effectively interpret and communicate statistical analyses into organizational policy recommendations.

MBA 600 02: Modern Issues in HRM - This course emphasizes five contemporary HRM trends in the workplace. The Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM) lists several of these trends as critical for HR professionals' success in the coming years. These trends include management of knowledge workers, contemporary hiring strategies, workforce training and gamification, work/life balance, and demographic issues in talent management. An evaluation of the utility of HR departments in the modern workforce is also examined.
