Green Dot is Alfred University's bystander intervention strategy to end power-based violence (sexual assault, stalking, harassment, dating/domestic violence, etc.).

The training introduces the basic elements of Green Dot, focusing specifically on the vital role faculty and staff play in establishing and reinforcing the culture that students exist within.
