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Resin Bonded Sand Molding Workshop with Morgan Donohue

Monday Oct 10th and 11th 2016
National Casting Center Foundry

Morgan Donohue : Master Sand Mold Technician from World Renowned Polich Tallix Foundry will be joining us at the National Casting Center Foundry. He will be working with students on patterns to be cast in Iron at the annual 'MeltDown' Iron Pour.

If you are simply intrigued or have a molding question or pattern you are welcome to join us for any of the sessions listed below.

If you have a pattern that you are interested to cast please bring it to one of the tech sessions on Monday and follow up with another session on Tuesday. Your pattern can be made out of plasticine, found or altered object. A pattern is what we will start with to make the mold. Plan to attend two sessions, one on Monday and one on Tuesday to get the full experience and technical advice of how to

move forward with your mold.

Monday is for mold making discussion, technical problem solving and planning. Tuesday we hope to begin making the molds, mixing sand and ramming the first parts. There will be a cost for materials such as sand and iron. You may be required to purchase other materials such as wood, bolts, steel etc. depending upon your individual project needs.

Session 3: Monday- 6-9pm
Session 4: Tuesday- 8:20-11:30am
Final Session: Tuesday- 1:30pm - 4pm

You will be left with a plan to follow in order to complete your mold. Morgan will be returning for the week leading up to 'MeltDown' Oct 24th - 28th to assist with finishing the molds ready to be cast in Iron on Sat 29th Oct.

Currently working at Pollich-Tallix, Morgan Donohue has 28 years' of sand mold making experience. He has molded and cast ambitious sculptures by Von Rydingsvard, Otterness, Koons, Shapiro, Oldenburg, Noguchi and the DiVinci Horse, to name a few. His work is found in Washington, D.C. at the FDR Memorial, Japanese Internment Camp Memorial, the Korean War Memorial and the Holocaust Museum. Traveling around the world, his work can be found in sculpture parks, sports venues and municipal installations.

This library contains a wide variety of downloadable AU images ranging from seasonal campus scenics, to classrooms/labs, to selected campus events. To access, please go to our.alfred.edu and scroll down the left-hand side to Faculty/Staff. Click on Faculty/Staff and scroll down to Gallery Server Pro.

Gallery Server images are cataloged by semester, by month and by topic, and as new photo assignments are completed, additional images will be cataloged and posted on a regular basis. The photos are extensively tagged to assist in searches for specific subjects.

NOTE: The images have been carefully selected from more extensive photo sessions that include

alternative views and formats (landscape vs portrait). Those images are archived separately and you will need to contact Rick McLay, director of Creative Services at 2736 (mclay@alfred.edu) to inquire about those additional images. There is also a separate folder dedicated to faculty/staff portraits, many of which were completed the week of Aug. 17, 2015.

TO DOWNLOAD

Access to Gallery Server requires AU username/password to review images and to download in three formats: 1. Thumbnail (small image), 2. Web optimized (low resolution but full size), and 3. Original (high resolution). To download the image of your choice, use the download/share icon, which is the one on the left in the icon grouping above each image, and follow the directions.
