Glen Cook became chief scientist for The Corning Museum of Glass after 16 years at Corning Incorporated as a senior research associate, conducting research in inorganic materials processing and composition.

As chief scientist, Cook is responsible for researching and sharing scientific and technical topics in glass. He informs exhibitions, programs and publications, and also serves as a technical resource for the broader museum community, museum guests and the general public, as well as artists working in glass today.

In 2013, Cook's outstanding record was recognized with Corning Incorporated's prestigious Stookey Award for cutting-edge exploratory and applied research, as well as in recognition of being the named inventor on more than two dozen patent applications.

From 2012 to 2014, Cook has collaborated closely with Museum glassmakers in glass forming process research. Cook is also the technical advisor to the new Specialty Glass Artist-in-Residence program that is jointly managed by Corning Incorporated and The Corning Museum of Glass.

Cook holds a PhD and MS in metallurgical engineering from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and a BS in materials engineering from the New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology.

Ordering Toshiba MFP Toners

Beginning Monday, October 3rd, Toshiba online ordering will add a field to input your MFP's (copier's) serial number. The serial number will ensure ordering accuracy on Toshiba's end by letting them view the usage on your device.

Since toner does expire, keeping unused toners for an extended period of time is not recommended.

You can also order your toners over the phone by calling the 800 number on the front of your MFP. Your MFP toner cartridges are free with our current contract.

As a friendly reminder, please do not give out your serial number to any phone solicitors. This is usually a scam. Either transfer this call to Procurement Services (x. 2698), or simply hang up.
