Please note that you may now request a maximum amount of up to \$1,500 for your SOS opportunity. There will also be a total of two SOS deadlines this year.

The next deadline is Sept. 24, 2010. This deadline is for opportunities occurring between November 1,

2010 and May 31, 2011.

1. Applicants must be at least 18 years old and a full-time resident for the past year of one of the participating New York State counties (see step 3 or page 6 of the application.
