Dragon dance is a form of traditional dance in Chinese culture. It is most often seen in festive celebrations. Dragons are believed to bring good luck to people, together with great power, dignity, fertility, wisdom and auspiciousness. During the Dance, 12-14 performers will be holding the dragon up on poles. They will raise and lower the Dragon making the movement as they wind through the crowds to the sounds of horns, drums and gongs.

The Taichi Group of Alfred Community will practice different sets of Taichi: the 24-Step sequence, the Five-Animal exercises and the Youlong Quan. The slow, soft, and continuously flowing movements Tai Chi, is not only an ancient martial art, but also has been widely acknowledged as an effective health exercise, and the cultivation of one's internal energy.
