Jason Chakravarty will be the Visiting Artist in the neon department from 11th-15th of November. He will be teaching the neon classes as well as making studio visits to seniors. Sign-up sheet will be on my door BM room 19.

Jason Chakravarty is a mixed media object maker. The majority of his work is cast glass and often incorporates neon for illumination. Glass can be anything; thick, thin, shiny, dull, rough, smooth, transparent, or opaque.

It is the only material that can capture light. While material and notably glass are important, his emphasis is within the narrative focusing on the ideas of identity within culture. His most recent works reflect on human relationships, communication, and social networking.

Jason comes to Alfred fresh from exhibiting at SOFA Chicago with Riley Galleries.

Anton Reijnders: Visiting Artist Lecture

Anton Reijnders, an internationally recognized ceramic artist, will present a lecture about his work on Thursday, Nov. 14, 2013 at 7 P.M. in Binns Merrill Lecture Room 106.

Reijnders has exhibited throughout the world, and has work in public collections in Europe, Asia and the United States. For 17 years, he was in charge of the materials research program at the European Ceramic Work Center in 's-Hertogenbosch, The Netherlands. In that role, he worked with many well - known artists, including Tony Cragg, Anish Kapoor, Johan Creten, and Jun Kaneko.

Many Alfred University alumni have participated in the EKWC residency program. Reijnders was a Visiting Faculty in the Division of Ceramic Art at Alfred University in 2006. He is a member of the International Ceramics Academy.

Reijnders is the author of "The Ceramic Process, A Manual and Source of Inspiration for Ceramic Art and Design." Based on his research at the EKWC, the book covers ceramic materials in process in great detail. It is one of the essential texts that should be on every ceramic artist's bookshelf.

On his website, **www.antonreijnders.nl**, Reijnders describes his artistic practice: "My work stems from a fascination with questions of meaning and how we make sense of what is around us. I want my work to offer an opportunity for concentration and to provide an alternative to images that are increasingly subservient to quick effects."
