It is conducted at the Stull Observatory on the Alfred University campus from Friday, June 12-Wednesday, June 15. Alfred University physics and astronomy faculty direct the program. Students enjoy a mix of night and daytime activities involving extensive use of the observatory's telescopes and electronics. Some institute topics include astronomical basics, variable star photometry, asteroid astrometry, and photometry. Students also study lunar and planetary science, solar flares, stellar evolution, CCD imaging, galactic structure, special relativity, black holes, cosmology, and spectroscopy. This institute is for students entering grades 11 or 12 who wish to prepare to continue their education at a top art school. Topics include building a strong portfolio and careers in the arts. The program features portfolio reviews, drawing sessions, a trip to a professional artist's studio, and presentations on different artists' career paths. Students will bring their portfolios to campus with them for review. The deadline for applications is Wednesday, April 15 and the institute cost is \$725. The first institute takes place Sunday, June 28-Thursday July 2, and the second institute takes place Sunday, July 5-Thursday July 9. The application deadline for both sessions is Wednesday, April 15. Students participate in writing-intensive exercises designed to address the elements of craft: voice, character, image, scene, and setting. They also read and discuss the work of established authors,

investigating the strategies used to craft their poetry and prose. Students have an opportunity to work one-on-one with faculty, as well as to attend readings by visiting writers.
