

Highlights of campus activities Feb. 15-18

This week in February features a Bergren Forum, two movies, a dance concert and a musical concert. The annual February dance concert titled "Evening of Dance" will start at 8 p.m. on Thursday, Feb. 15 through Saturday, Feb. 17, with a matinee at 2 p.m. on Saturday. The concert will take place in the CD Smith Theater, Miller Performing Arts Center. On Thursday, Feb. 15, Spanish Professor Arianna Huberman will be speaking in the Nevins Theater, Powell Campus Center at 12:10 p.m. on "What is Exotic?" Huberman will discuss the concept of exoticism, focusing on Chilean author and filmmaker Alejandro Jodorowsky's treatment of the strange and the supernatural in his films, writings, comics and public performances. Beginning on Friday, Feb. 16, there will be three showings of "Casino Royale," an action-drama rated PG-13, which centers on the character James Bond (Daniel Craig) who takes on a corrupt casino owner with ties to terrorists. Bond's back-story will be told as the action-packed film travels to the Bahamas, Madagascar and other exotic locations. Eva Green and Jeffrey Wright join the cast and Judi Dench reprises her role as M. The movie runs on Friday at 8 and 11 p.m., and on Sunday, Feb. 18, at 2 p.m. in Nevins Theater, Powell Campus Center. On Saturday, Feb. 17, the movie "Water-proof" will be playing at 7 p.m. in the Nevins Theater. The film created by the college-aged members of Orphan Boys Productions, an independent film company based in Rochester; share a passion for cultural exploration and social justice. "Water-proof" is their first feature film and explores the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina.
