Requests will not guarantee support. Instead, you may need to be trained or have someone assisting with your program be trained on how to use the technology. This is because there is no professional technician for Nevins Theater and access to support is subject to the availability of student technicians.

Some things to keep in mind when using Nevins Theater:

- \* You will need to bring a computer with you if you plan on projecting onto the screen for the audience to see. We do not keep any laptops in Nevins, but faculty/staff should be able to acquire one from ITS Equipment Lending (x3009) on the 3rd floor of Perlman Hall.
- \* Mac users: If you plan on using an Apple computer, please bring the appropriate Display to VGA adapter. Again, we do not keep any of these in the theater. ITS Equipment Lending may be able to help with adapters.
- \* Audio projection is accessible for videos or other sound bites you may want to play during your presentation. Please plan to play the audio files from your computer.
- \* There is wireless and wired Internet connection in Nevins Theater. If you plan on using YouTube or any other streaming website, I recommend that you plan on using our wired connection.

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### **Arthur L. and Lea R. Powell Distinguished Lecture in Psychology**

Dr. Frank Farley, psychologist and L.H. Carnell Professor at Temple University, Philadelphia, will deliver the 2013 Arthur and Lea R. Powell Distinguished Lecture in Psychology. The lecture will be presented in Nevins Theater (in the Powell Campus Center) Friday, April 26 at 10 a.m.

The lecture is open to the public and free of charge, though registration is required.

The lecture is entitled "EXTREME PEOPLE - Seeking a Common Thread Among Risk-takers, Heroes, Leaders, Innovators, Entrepreneurs, Thrill Seekers, Delinquents, and More."

Dr. Farley will discuss the nature of risk-taking, both positive and negative, including heroism, creativity, and other topics. He will suggest how various kinds of risk-taking behavior may be linked, as well as their role in child and adolescent development.

Dr. Farley asserts that to understand American society requires an understanding of how risk-taking qualities underlie its enormous creativity on the one hand, and its high-crime rate on the other. He will make recommendations for delinquency and violence reduction, education, healthy child-rearing and family practices, the happy life, and more.
