

Environmental Series focuses on land use change in Hudson Valley

Karin Limburg, associate professor in environmental biology at the State University of New York Environmental Science and Forestry campus, Syracuse, will speak at the Friday Nov. 18 Environmental Studies Speaker Series at Alfred University. The program runs from 12:20-1:10 p.m. in room 228 of the Science Center. "Connecting the Dots: Modeling and Measuring Process and Consequences of Land Use Change in the Hudson River Valley" is Limburg's topic. Limburg earned a master of science degree in environmental engineering science from the University of Florida, and a Ph.D. from Cornell University in ecology and evolutionary biology. She is president-elect of the U.S. Society of Ecological Economics and in her third year of a CAREER grant to link her interest in fisheries and watersheds. Her collaborators include ecologists, fisheries scientists, economists, and particle physicists. Everyone is welcome to the program, free of charge; refreshments will be served.
