THEOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.

ADMISSION.

This Department is open for the admission of students from every denomination of Christians. Every student applying for admission must be prepared to produce a certificate of good standing in some evangelical church. The academic year consists of three terms, corresponding with the terms of College instruction. Public examinations at the close of each term.

COURSE OF STUDY.

The regular course of theological study in this Department occupies three full years. The general order of study in the different departments of Theology is as follows:

JUNIOR CLASS.

Biblical. Hebrew Grammar and Exercises; Portions of the Pentateuch and Psalms in Hebrew; Lectures on Introduction to the New Testament; Exegesis of the Four Gospels in the Greek Harmony.

Theological. Theology, as based on the nature and laws of Mind; the Evidences of Christianity, Inspiration and Canon of the Scriptures; the Introduction to Theology, God's nature, attributes, and works.

Historical. Lectures on the History of the World before Christ; Life of Christ.

Homiletical. Lectures on Pastoral Theology.

MIDDLE CLASS.

Biblical. Hebrew Exegesis, Isaiah; Greek Exegesis, Epistles of the New Testament.

Theological. Anthropology, including the Doctrine of Sin.

Homiletical. Lectures on the Constitution and Mission of the Church.

Historical. History of the Apostolic Church, and Ecclesiastical History to the Council of Nice, 325 A. D.

SENIOR CLASS.

Biblical. Hebrew Exegesis continued; Greek Exegesis, Epistles of the New Testament.

Theological. Christology, including the Doctrine of Redemption.

Eschatology. Lectures on the Sabbath, Baptism, and Lord's Supper.

Historical. The General History of the Church from the fourth century to the present time.

Homiletical. Lectures on the Composition and Delivery of Sermons, with Exercises.

No charge for tuition or room-rent, for those rooming in the College buildings, is made for students who are studying in this Department with a design to enter the ministry. There is already a well selected Theological Library, to which valuable additions will be made as fast as possible. There are constant opportunities for students to engage in labor, with small congregations and Sabbath Schools, and thus not only do good service for others, but become the recipients of aid. There are also measures instituted for the purpose of aiding such as may need pecuniary assistance. No possible means or labor will be spared, on the part of the Faculty, to meet all the appointments in this Department.

DEGREES.—Students who have sustained a good moral character, and satisfactorily completed either of the prescribed Courses, will be admitted to a Degree, the Degree corresponding to the Course, as follows: BACHELOR OF ARTS, for the Classical Course; LAUREATE OF ARTS, BACHELOR OF SCIENCE or PHILOSOPHY, determined by the Electives of the Literary and Scientific Course; BACHELOR OF INDUSTRIAL MECHANICS, for the Course of Industrial Mechanics; BACHELOR OF LAUREATE OF EDUCATION, for the Normal or Teachers' Course; The Advanced Degrees of A. M., S. M., Ph. M., M. I. M., and E. M. are conferred, in course, upon such as are entitled to them.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION.

LOCATION.

The Institution is located at Alfred, Allegany Co., N. Y., two miles from the Alfred Depot of the Erie Railway.

The location is retired and healthy—in a rural district, surrounded by delightful scenery, amid a people of integrity, and of industrious and unobtrusive habits. Students are not exposed here to many of the ordinary allurements to vice and dissipation. Few spots are so well adapted to the quiet and successful pursuit of Science and Literature as the village of Alfred.

GOVERNMENT.

Parents who place their children in this Institution, and all Students who are sufficiently old to understand the necessity of order, cannot be too well assured that the following regulations form the most essential part of the contract between them and us; and that whatever Student wantonly violates them, and shows himself incorrigibly determined on pursuing his waywardness, will be expelled from the privileges of the Institution.

SUMMARY OF REGULATIONS.

REQUISITIONS.

1. Registry of name, and satisfactory arrangements with regard to rooms and board.
2. Payment or security of bills in advance.
3. Punctuality in attending all regular academic exercises, and faithful observance of study hours.
4. Faithful observance of temporary prudential rules.
5. Faithful observance of one's Sabbath.
6. Information, if asked, concerning delinquencies or misconduct of others.
7. Free access of any teacher to the rooms of Students.
8. Habits of good order and propriety at all times and places.

PROHIBITIONS.

1. Unpermitted association of ladies and gentlemen.
2. Visiting at improper times or places.
3. The use of tobacco or intoxicating drinks.
4. Games of chance, profane or obscene language.
5. Changing or dropping a study without permission.
6. Leaving school or village without permission.
7. Absence from examination.
8. All disorder and impropriety of conduct.

REGULAR ACADEMIC EXERCISES.

The regular exercises, which all the Students will be required to attend, unless especially excused, are chapel exercises each day during the term; Recitations, from two to four, five days each week, from Monday morning till Friday evening; Regular exercises in Compositions, Declamations, Spelling, Reading, and Writing; Literary, Scientific, and Moral Lectures, by the Faculty; Public worship, each week, either on Saturday or Sunday, and Bible-class, according as the Students may be in the habit of attending public worship, either on the seventh or the first day of the week.

ROOMS AND BOARD.

The University Hall contains the Boarding Department, and rooms for the accommodation of about one hundred Students, besides rooms for Professors and their families, and also Society, Music, and Paint Rooms. *Rooms for Ladies are furnished and carpeted, with a sleeping room adjoining each.* The Hall is under the immediate supervision of the Faculty. There is also abundant accommodation for rooming and boarding in private families.

1. All bills must be paid in advance.
2. In case of absence, no deduction will be made on tuition bills as arranged, except in cases of absence from sickness, and then not more than one-half

of the full bill; and no deduction in board bill, except in cases of sickness or leaving to teach.

3. Parents and Guardians are earnestly solicited not to furnish money to be squandered on useless and frivolous things, nor permit their children or wards to contract debts for the same, thus laying the foundation for extravagant and reckless habits.

The Alleghanian, the Orophilian, the Alfredian, and the Athenean are the permanently organized Societies of the Institution. They are managed with ability, and are important aids to those who are desirous of becoming good writers and speakers.

OBSERVATORY.

The object of the Observatory is two-fold, viz: to facilitate instruction in Astronomy, and to perform such astronomical work as time, limited by classroom duties, will allow.

The Observatory building consists of a circular room surmounted by a revolving dome 19 feet in diameter, a computing room 12x13, a prime vertical room 12x13, a transit room 12x20, and a clock room 8x20.

The Observatory is furnished with the following instruments:

1. An equatorial refracting telescope, by Henry Fitz, with an object glass of 9 inch clear aperture, and 9.5 feet focus.

II. A meridian circle, by Wm. J. Young, with an object glass by Merz & Mahler, Germany, of 3.25 inch clear aperture, and 4.5 feet focus. The circle is 20 inches in diameter, and reads by 4 verniers to 3 seconds of space.

III. A sidereal chronometer.

IV. A filar micrometer. Value, \$125.

Students in Astronomy have the privileges of the Observatory without extra charge.

LIBRARY.

The Institution Library consists of a choice selection of Histories, Biographies, Greek and Latin Classics, Mathematical and Scientific works, and standard English Literature. Additions are made to it yearly.

GYMNASIUM.

A Gymnasium for young Ladies has recently been established in connection with the Boarding Hall, where all young Ladies boarding in the Institution will be expected to take daily exercise.
