Very windy in the evening - Start at 1 1/2 pm with 7 horses - Douglas, Christie, Mr. Inters, Hurley, Supple, Int. & Daniels, guide. Rations for 8 days. Camp at 5 miles from Ly. place.

Fine weather. Finish the sleigh - Start at 1 1/2 pm. 7 horses, 4 men, Inters, guide, Camp at 5 miles from Ly. place. Snow threatens at night. Drove about 25 miles. Beautiful

Weather fine. Late start ^{last night} and a horse which ran back to Ly. - Misty all day - Drove about 25 miles - Beautiful night

Windy & cold - Start at 8 1/4 - Camp at 3 1/2 - Snow at night. Horses do very well - Road pretty good for sleighing -

February SATURDAY 16

1878

Weather mild & misty. Start at
8½ a.m. Stopped at 9 - Arrived at
Muddy Coulee at 10½. Starts to come
back at 1 P.M. (See Memo.) Drove 16

to stop it after the Creek - decide
to go to Pine 14, 13, to morning
to the Lewis Merri's wagon -
No more oats & I am anxious
to know what they are about
at Ft. W. that they send me
by this fine weather.

WEDNESDAY 27

Very windy - Start at 12 3/4 with
Major. Hurly, Douglass & all
6 horses - Drive to old wife
creek & camp for night -
Great wind at night; appearance
of snow - Cold.

February THURSDAY 28

1878

Time: I am 37 years old to day.
 Born in 41 - 10 years ago, came out on the Ocean.
 Start at 9. Camped for the night at
 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ - Start again at 2 - Arrive at
 the house at 3 $\frac{1}{2}$. Nobody here.

1878

Rain & windy. Prepare to go to Indian
camp about 11 mi.

Start at 1 p.m. Camped at 5.
Drove about 25 miles -

SATURDAY 9

Very windy & cold -

Start at 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ arrive at camp
11 $\frac{1}{2}$ a.m. Storm commences again
at 4 p.m. & increases in intensity
Feb 10 - Continues all night.

March

SUNDAY 10

1878

Stormy in the morning. Clear
up about 12 m.

The Ind. coming in from the
States are some of our Ind. who
have been out hunting.

Start at 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ - Drove 12 miles &
camped in a very nice place,
well sheltered; no water though.

MONDAY 11

Very stormy - Start at 8 $\frac{1}{2}$
Dined at 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ - Lost
the count. Very much
afraid to be obliged to camp
out again - Reached the
Post at 6 p.m. -

March

TUESDAY 12

1878

Mild & thawing.
 Heavy of Snow in the
 but it taken off.
 Sign a pass for McIntosh
 to go out hunting 6 days.
 Will return on the 19th.
 News come that Bear cap & Co
 Lodge is coming this way. Will be
 here I suppose in 4 or 5 days.

1878

Fine day. Nothing new.

1878

Very windy & pretty cold.

Lager comes in & camp on the hill close to the Fort. Bad voice (Benl me) is among them. Made a pair of howls for my epus. Will Helen come to-day ???

SUNDAY 17 St. Patrick

Bright & lovely day. Mr. Intash & Lila return. All the Big-Pevis are gone out hunting north. The two who came in yesterday move camp this morning. Some to Leg's place. Sitting Bull out hunting. Send out Hall with team to meet Douglas.

Helen not in yet. Ride to Leg's. Gilson will go to Wolf Pt. on Tuesday. Send letters by train.

March

MONDAY 18

1878

Pretty cold & dark. Wrote to Lambert & L. H. F. & de Georges.

White Gutt comes in & says the Am. agent at Reck invited him & all other Sioux to go back to the U.S.

TUESDAY 19

St. Joseph

Cold & windy. S.W. wind. Gilson starts for Wolf Point with White Gutt.

Rain commences at 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ p.m. Expect Douglas in to-night. Rain at 8 p.m. Weather clears a little. Douglas not in.

March

WEDNESDAY 20

1878

Beautiful Summer of Klyne came
at 12 noon
Left my seal & part of watch
chain

THURSDAY 21

Fine day - Wacam-pa-o-mi-mi
comes to see me -

March

FRIDAY 22

1878

Mrs. M. Three comes in
with a party to pursue
deserters from B. Ford -
(Marshall, Balfe, Elliott & Half B. Deschamps)
Elliott got married one of Col. Richardson's daughters
& at night went to fetch her when he was threatened
by the Col. with 14 years penitentiary for abduction.
They were confined & Elliott was much scared
that he skedaddled - Mrs. McKean gives me
these details (6th April) 78

SATURDAY 23

Ride up to Lij. with McArthur
at 9 p. m. Lapierre comes
in the boat & says the
deserters are at Lij. place
start out with party of men

March

SUNDAY 24

1878

Return from the muskeg
sawed. pretty tired. Come in
at 11 a.m.

Sleep in the afternoon -

MONDAY 25

McIlree starts in the
morning -

An Ind. comes at night to tell me that
the visettes have been seen to-day. I
saddle up & go out - I send Sney to
Camp. He returns to say it's old news
the Ind. brought in.

March

TUESDAY 26

1878

Cold & windy
Ls. Morin starts in the morning
for Ft Walsh - Christie will
arrest - Prepare to send
him to Ft Walsh for
trial -

WEDNESDAY 27

Cold & windy. Francis Douglas &
Clarke acc^{to} Christie to Ft W. They start
at 12 m. Legon comes here & arranges
Hudson & Francis in the case - He is going
to Wolf Point to-day.
The calf is 15 days old.
Expect Gillson to-morrow.

March

THURSDAY 28

1878

Cold & Windy. Hear that a priest is
 Leg's. He is sick. Go to see him in
 the aft. noon. His father J. B. M.
 Genin O. J. M.

FRIDAY 29

Cold & Windy. Lost the cow at
 night.

Recd 45 bushels coal.
 (L. Morin heard thunder at the pile of cotton
 It rained a good deal there; 11 Apr)

March

SATURDAY 30

1878

Snowy & Stormy. The cow was
 found in the morning,
 Clichy, under arrest & admonished.
 Send M. D. to inquire if there will
 be Mass to morrow. The father
 is too sick to perform the
 service.

SUNDAY 31

Beautiful Summer day.
 There was Mass at Leg's but
 I did not know it.
 Ride up to Leg's, after the reception
 of an official communication
 from the Missionary with regard
 to the movements of Indians. Will send
 a messenger to-morrow or Tuesday to
 Cypress Hills. (See Journal) Fraser went
 to Leg's at 11th from where not back. I think
 they are deserted.

April

MONDAY 1

1878

Beautiful day. Seemingly the two men have deserted. Sent to the 2nd camp. They were not seen there.

Sent swift messenger to Fort Walsh with reports of desertion & Indian movements. Gather Genin came in to stop with me. He is sick.

No news at night.

TUESDAY 2

Beautiful summer day.

Had mass this morning. Christ a little better. A party of H.B. from Milk River come in at 4 p.m. André Desjarlais & Pierre a little better. Giesbach.

The Sioux have a white calf skin & have arranged to have a grand mas. meeting to bring the Buffalo near them.

April

WEDNESDAY 3

1878

Wintry but mild. Légaré came from H.B. last night. Some H.B. came to mass this morning. Antoine Desjarlais claims that that was quarried this winter. Will write to Col. Irvine about it.

Sent Duprez to Ind. camp at the Medicine Feast to try & know what are the projects of Ind. but he can't get any information. Surprised that L.J. Don not come to see the priest. — White Gull came in from Regina.

THURSDAY 4

Fine weather. My messenger ought to be in H.B. to-night. Would like to know what they think of my news. Mrs. L. Morin pays a visit to the father — 5 great girls are riding on the plains. N.W. — N. — N.E. — E by S. N. N. E.

Nothing news.

April

FRIDAY 5th

1878

Nice cold day. It rained a little during the night. Great few more of his. at Leg send me etc. to know what passes. Hunter Genim will go to the camp to-morrow.

The Inds. have received a kind of message from U.S. & wanted advice about surrendering - They seem to wait for advice from Sitting Bull's camp.

SATURDAY 6th

Fine day. Sent for Lacarte who tells me that he is hunting the Inds. himself yesterday. Leger says not. The Inds. wanted to have news from W. Point. I said I would go to the Camp to invite Pretty Bear & 4 men to visit me to-morrow.

Mr. McLean of Pu'aspuille came in. Rain in the afternoon & evening.

April

SUNDAY 7th

1878

Rained a good deal last night.

Mass at 9^h. Half B. come in number Indians, Pretty Bear, White Gosh & 6 men came to interview the Father & Mr. McLean - Very windy at night.

MONDAY 8th

Clear, cold & very windy - wind N.W.

Inds. come from Cypress & say that S. B. is on Swift current Creek with a great number of lodges of Sioux. Mr. Perot &c.

I expected Douglas to-day but he did not come.

Hires Lacarte as hunter. Started for the Probs.

April

TUESDAY 9

1878

Wind + snow - N.W.
 As H.B. came from Cape N. & said that
 100 lodges of his had crossed the Mts. but
 he did not know where they were.
 It was cold + raw all day. At night a snow
 storm is feared.

WEDNESDAY 10

Clear but cold windy.
 Mr. McLean left for Chappelle at 2 1/2 pm.
 The wind falls at sunset. I am much im-
 pressed than the messenger on Douglas does
 not turn up. As I write this Lt. Morn
 comes in sight. He brings letters +
 a few news papers. No news
 except that Major Irvine
 will probably be here shortly.

April

THURSDAY 11

1878

Fine day. Strong N.W. wind -
 Lt. Morn says that Joe Polette told him that
 some troops were coming from Canada.
 No arrivals. Splendid night.
 McAllen writes that Major Irvine was
 gone to Boston when Christie arrived
 + my men were kept for the trial.
 Col. J. was expected back on Sat-
 urday or Sunday.

FRIDAY 12

Fine day. Take a drive out to see
 if any body comes but none! -

April

SATURDAY 13

1878

The calf I m^d sold to day -
 Clear day but very strong wind, S. E.
 Got the father's wagon fixed.

A very large fire was started out
 in the afternoon at 4^{1/2} miles N. E. &
 lasted all night going Westward.
 The father's mare strayed to day &
 could not be found.

No news yet from Capt. H. Does not
 understand why my messenger is not
 back yet.

SUNDAY 14

Palm Sunday.

Strong wind S. E. Had divine service &
 some 35 N. B. were present. Found the
 father's mare. Fire raging N. E. - N. W. W.
 Wind changed to N. E. - at 12 m. & a very severe
 snow came on at 3 p.m. Poor travellers will have
 no fun on the plains.

Put the father's mare in the forge with her colt.

April

MONDAY 15

1878

The storm continued all night very
 severely - At 12 m. it seems to increase -
 I must be fearful at App. H. & wonder if my
 men will ever come back.

Storm all day.

The wind stopped at about
 12 p.m.

TUESDAY 16

This mild day. Snow falls very lightly still.
 Snow stops at 11 a.m. & melts away very fast.
 Getting chilly at night.
 No animals yet.

April

WEDNESDAY 17

1878

Full moon to-day.

Wind recommenced to blow from N- during the night & in the morning we have another snow storm.

At 3 1/2 p.m. snow changes into heavy rain which lasts till all night.

Wind falls a little at sunset.

Killed the calf to-day. It is a great treat after so long a fast.

The ground comes down from the walls. ^{It makes a fine snow in the house.} Nothing new.

THURSDAY 18

Rain continues till 12 m. N. wind very strong & cold. Pitch my tent to day. Sun shines part of the after. & dries the ground a good deal. The square was like a lake this morning.

April

FRIDAY 19

1878

Good Friday.

Rain came again at midnight & lasted till 10 a.m. - Fine weather in the afternoon. It rains again at night - Wind seems to change to the W.

SATURDAY 20

Weather seems to settle fine. Mr. Bonell drives to Leg. with the father -

No arrivals yet. Everything seems quiet. Very few birds come around.

April

SUNDAY 21

1878

Easter Sunday

Mass at 10 - Numerous congregation.

Weather very cloudy & undecided -
 alternate rain & sunshine all day.
 Sent Ryan on the road to see if anything
 was coming. Saw nothing.

The weather is fine at night.

No arrivals yet.

Rain begins again at 10½ p.m. -

April

TUESDAY 23

1878

Fine weather - I sent 3 men to
 the lake to hunt geese &
 duck to keep the wolf at the
 gate. Pretty Bear & White Bear
 moved their camps to-day.
 They are going towards old work.

No arrivals.

MONDAY 22

Fine weather all day.
 Addition to the gymnasium of
 a leaping bar.

At 11, messenger comes in
 at 10 p.m. with 3 newspapers
 pay receipts & letters -
 Not a word of communication
 but ^{very} ^{much} ^{more} ^{curious!!!} &
 very unsatisfactory.

WEDNESDAY 24

Fine weather. The hunters
 came back with 1 goose
 & 6 ducks.

April

THURSDAY 25

1877

A 4 a.m. a mighty hurricane blew from
N.W. for ^{last} 3 hours - ^{one} day. I wonder if anything
will turn up to day. It is now
25 days since I sent my dog
& not a word of answer has
come. The father saw bear & the men go out
but can't find him. Took a drive in the aft.
His Lafournaise of 18? came from C.H.

FRIDAY 26

Very dull - Rains slowly now & then.
It took meat for LaBucane & Lafournaise.
Gets cold in the after.
An ind. from "Medicine Bear" says
that Mr. Makin is on one branch of
the muddy the other side of line.
Rained pretty heavily until 12
p.m. -

April

SATURDAY 27

1878

Fine day - S.W. wind - It is one mile today
that Douglas & party went away with Christie &
I have no news of them yet. It is strange to say
the least.

Drove out this after but
saw nothing on the road.

No arrivals.

SUNDAY 28

Quasimodo. Clear day but
strong wind S. - Mass. & H. B. presents
Sampson comes in the after.
I cannot imagine what is keeping me from
having news from H.W. I know a man
who will go to-morrow. I will not
hear that suspense any longer.
I strongly suspect that my men were
sent from H.W. but that they lost them-
selves in the storm -

April

MONDAY 29

1878

Fine day but strong W. wind.
Send a messenger to Ft. W. with dispatches.
At 5 p.m. shower of rain.

No arrivals.

TUESDAY 30

Clear day but very strong W. wind -
The messenger I sent yest. comes back at
4 p.m. He lost his horse last night.
Father G. goes to remain at Ft. H. Camp
2 hrs. & Morn. to go to Ft. W. but as
he goes to get his horses he meets Willy
Edley & Carillon. They bring news
Seymour is ready to start on 26th or 27th

May

WEDNESDAY 1

Fine bright. W. wind - Father & Corby
came. Segarlais came fm. Milk R. & told
me that 4 Indians of Little W. M. went over the line
to steal horses & murder somebody if they have a
chance.
