Web of Science Database Trial - Tell Us What You Think!

Web of Science (Science Citation Index Expanded 1955 - Present) is available on our campus on a trial basis until Friday, Dec. 13.

Web of Science (WOS) is known for its extensive indexing of scientific articles. In particular, it's noted for its citation map which graphically displays forward and backward citations, i.e. how many references a particular article has and how many future articles referred to it in their reference list. This gives a strong indication of the importance of an article.

Scholes Library is sponsoring this trial as part of our ongoing efforts to assess current database offerings and evaluate potential new resources that provide the most relevant mix of research tools for our campus.

To achieve this, we need your help. Please take WOS out for a spin and let us know what you think. Feel free to comment on how it compares to current offerings.

The Tax Counseling for the Elderly Program (TCE) offers free income tax assistance for low to moderate income Allegany County residents. Volunteer Counselors are trained and certified to help people who are 60 and over with federal, state and local returns. Volunteers handle basic forms. If the client's return is more involved, the volunteer directs the person to go to a paid preparer. The training is in Belmont Jan. 13, 15, 17, 21, 22 and 24, 2014.
