

SUNY Senate president to speak at Alfred University

ALFRED, NY – Gwen Kay, president of the SUNY University Faculty Senate, will speak Tuesday, March 27, at Alfred University. The talk, titled “How Shared Governance Can Work For You,” will be from 2 to 3 p.m. in Holmes Auditorium, Harder Hall.

Kay, a professor of history at SUNY Oswego, was appointed in July to a two-year term as president of the SUNY University Faculty Senate. In that role, she also serves as a member of the SUNY Board of Trustees.

She previously was vice president and secretary of SUNY University Faculty Senate, and in that capacity served on both the Applied Learning Task Force and Applied Learning Steering Committee; the Micro Credentialing Task Force; planning committee for Shared Voices conferences on governance; and the Shared Governance award committee.

Kay received her BA in history and biology from Bowdoin College, and her Ph.D. in history of medicine and science from Yale University.
