At least one Alfred University student has fallen victim to a scam in which an "employer" sends a check, asks the recipient to deposit it, and then forward funds to another account. The check proved to be fraudulent.

The Career Development Center and Public Safety advise that if an employer proposes such a scheme, asks you for send cash or information such as your Social Security number prior to hiring you, you should be cautious and check the prospective employer out.

Alfred University stands behind the idea that we all benefit when a greater share of Americans register and vote. This year there will be an important general election on Nov. 8, 2016. If you are not already registered to vote, please consider doing so now.

Alfred University students have a choice of registering and voting right here in Allegany County (if you have been a resident in your present address for at least 30 days before the election) or voting by absentee ballot in your home county or state. The choice is yours, but please plan to register and vote.

You can download the registration form and get more information about voting in New York State, including instructions on how to vote by absentee ballot, at this Web site maintained by the NYS Board of Elections: www.elections.ny.gov.

You can also stop by the Center for Student Involvement to pick up a form for NYS. The Center for Academic Success also have forms available.

Please make sure that to register to vote, you must complete the form, print it out, sign it, and mail it to the county's Board of Elections.
