

Alfred University men's Alpine ski team finishes 12th at national championships

LAKE TAHOE, CA The Alfred University men's Alpine ski team wrapped up its 2003 season with a 12th place finish at the United States Collegiate Ski Association (USCSA) national championships. Nineteen teams competed in the championships, which concluded Saturday in Lake Tahoe, CA. AU finished 11th in the giant slalom, held Thursday, March 6, and 15th in the slalom, held Saturday, March 8. Sophomore Jared Mostue (Hopkinton, HH/Proctor Academy) was Alfred's top skier, placing 37th in the giant slalom and 57th in the slalom. Junior Matt Seavey (Canandaigua/Canandaigua), the USCSA Mid-Atlantic Regional champion, placed 38th in the giant slalom and 85th in the slalom. Freshman Ryan Fuller (Canandaigua/Canandaigua) was 62nd in the giant slalom and 65th in the slalom. Freshman Tyler Ledgett (Kettering, ME/Gould Academy) and sophomore Angus Graham (Bethel, ME/Gould Academy), placed 83rd and 99th, respectively, in the slalom. Neither finished his giant slalom run Thursday. The championships wrapped up another solid season for Alfred skiers, who won a fifth consecutive men's conference crown, won three of five conference meets and placed fourth at the regional competition.
