TREASURER'S REPORT

The report of the Treasurer for the year ending June 30, 1926, is herewith transmitted to you under the following headings:

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The Endowment and Property account shows a total of \$1,428,-271.50, including funds held in trust for Alfred University by the Seventh Day Baptist Education Society, the Board of Trustees of the Seventh Day Baptist Memorial Fund, the Alumni Association of Alfred University, and the property of the State Schools at Alfred University

The net increase of the Endowment Funds held by the Treasurer for the year of 1925-26 amounts to the sum of \$63,609.18, of which \$46,944.15 was received from the General Education Board applying on their conditional pledge of \$100,000. The total amount received from the General Education Board on this pledge is \$76,529.97.

The total amount received for the Improvement Fund for the year was \$63,240.25 including the \$46,944.15 from the General Education Board.

An accumulated deficit of \$1,001.82: in the Theological Seminary account was paid in full during the year.

This report includes the report of the second Summer Session under the direct management of the Trustees of the University, and shows a balance of \$642.73 on hand after payment of all expenses including the payment of \$400 principal and \$66 interest to the former managers to apply on their deficit.

The Budget Estimate for Maintenance and Operation of the University for the year 1926-27, submitted with this report for the approval of the Trustees, shows estimated receipts of \$244,578 and estimated disbursements of \$244,384.

The Scholarship Fund consists of money and securities given or bequeathed to the University, to be invested and kept invested, the income only to be applied toward the payment of the tuition fees of worthy students in Alfred University, or for some other specially designated purpose.

A Scholarship may be established conditionally on the payment of \$100; if a payment of less than \$100 is made as an initial payment for this purpose, it is classified as a "prospective Scholarship" and the income from such payments will be used for the general purposes of the University until such time as the payments aggregate at least \$100.

The income only of the special funds is used for the purposes.

STATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Chapter 292, Laws of 1913

Became a law April 16, 1913

State Scholarships were established by act of the legislature of the State of New York, by Chapter 292, Laws o 1913, became a law April 16, 1913, taking effect August 1, 1913

Five such scholarships shall be awarded each county an nually for each assembly district therein.

Each such scholarship entitles the holder thereof to tilt sum of One Hundred dollars (\$100) for each year during which he is in attendance upon an approved college in New York state during a period of four years.

Alfred is on the list of such approved colleges.

Colleges are required, in February and September of each year, to submit to the Commissioner of Education a list of their pupils who are holders of State Scholarships. Payment is made by the State Treasurer to the Treasurer of the college, to be applied for the benefit of holders of State Scholarships who are in attendance, as follows:

- So far as needed to pay his tuition for the current semester.
 To reimburse the college for his other indebtedness thereto.
 To pay the remainder of his instalment to such pupil, or as thall direct. he shall direct.

BURDICK HALL BOARDING CLUB REPORT

(Organized September, 1919)

The boarding club, formerly located at Burdick Hall, known as the "Clan Alpine" having removed to a "Fraternity House" a new club was organized under the name "Burdick Hall Boarding Club." This club is operated on the co-operative or cost plan. The books and other records are kept by the University Treasurer who is known as the club "Cashier," and he is responsible for figuring the costs of board, making out and collecting the board bills, and for the payment of all expenses of the club. Board bills are rendered each week and expenses paid weekly. A deposit of \$10.00 is required from each member in order to furnish a working balance, this deposit being refunded when a member leaves the club. Waiters are given their board for their services. The University receives ten cents per day per memboard in this club for the year 1925-26, was 85 cents per day or \$5.95 per week.
