Members of the Alfred University Music Department will perform at the third Organ Spectacular on Sunday, Oct. 21, in order to raise funds for continuing maintenance needs of the Moller pipe organ.

Located in the Alfred Seventh Day Baptist Church, the organ has 23 ranks and was installed in 1930.

Organized by University Carillonneur Laurel Buckwalter, the program will open at 3 p.m. with one of the greatest organ compositions of all time, J. S. Bach's Toccata and Fugue in F Major, performed by Buckwalter.

Dr. Christopher Foster will perform the hauntingly beautiful "Gabriel's Oboe" from the film "The Mission." Violinists Dr. Lisa Lantz and new community member Eugenia Meltzer will perform Vivaldi's Concerto Grosso in D minor for Two Violins.
